Welcome to our end of vear review of the MCA member benefits we have delivered in 2021 and all the results we have achieved in partnership with our members across the consulting sector. The MCA has achieved a strong financial performance at the end of 2021 ahead of expectations, and an increase of 21% in member income from 2021-22 thanks to the growth in new members. We have a healthy pipeline of new consulting firms keen to apply to join the trade association and we look forward to working with new members in all our committees and working groups in the new year. The MCA has had a productive year meeting or exceeding all KPIs and implementing elements of the updated 5-year business plan, including more activities around sustainability and diversity and inclusion.

Our engagement with existing member firms continues to thrive and individual member engagements remains high with over 7,000 interactions to date. From sessions on the growth and size of the sector linked to our MCA Annual Report to workshops on hybrid working, diversity and inclusion, and sessions on sharing best practice on mental well-being, there has been a vast range of events that members have been able to join and participate in. We have held over 125 committee meetings and member events so

far this year, well exceeding our target.

Our promotional role in championing the work of the consulting sector has continued to be a major priority and we have conducted over 80 interviews with national iournalists as well as securing over 300 national, trade and online press mentions. The MCA has continued to drive high profile media campaigns throughout the year positioning the consulting sector positively in national, trade and broadcast media on a range of issues from the support given to clients, export growth, talent pipelines, new ways of working and diversity and inclusion efforts. Our website continues to attract more visitors each year and there has been a substantial increase in our followers on social media, particularly on LinkedIn.

Our work scaling the Chartered Management Consultant Award continues with our partners, the CMI, and over 40 firms are now engaged, and 2,500 consultants are on the journey to become Chartered. We continue to outreach to both MCA and non-MCA member firms to participate in this great new initiative for our consulting sector and our promotional work with clients will continue into next year.

Thank you to all our members for inputting into this work and putting forward speakers and representatives for our key events. We look forward to working with you all in 2022.

Listening has been at the heart of the Young MCA this year. We created new focus groups and virtual networking opportunities which allowed us to understand the benefits and complex challenges that lockdowns and the pandemic left behind. We also provided the MCA with key messaging on hybrid working, wellbeing and diversity and inclusion from the perspectives of young consultants.

The MCA has been a strong advocate in encouraging member firms and consulting leaders to put young consultants at the heart of growth and recovery plans, particularly around flexible working, diversity and inclusion, and learning & development. We saw Young MCA members join panel discussions at key events in the MCA 2021 calendar such as the MCA Member Survey and Annual Industry Report Launch events

This year the Young MCA hosted more than 20 online workshops and events which were attended by over a thousand young consultants from across member firms. Regular virtual networking sessions allowed young consultants to stay connected whilst remote working and we held a number of events focusing on mental wellbeing and resilience as well as workshops providing practical advice and tips on hybrid working at our event titled 'From Loungewear to Workwear - returning to the office with Confidence'.

Other event topics have included training on how to build an effective LinkedIn profile hosted by a digital media expert as well as how artificial intelligence is transforming business with guest speakers from Microsoft.

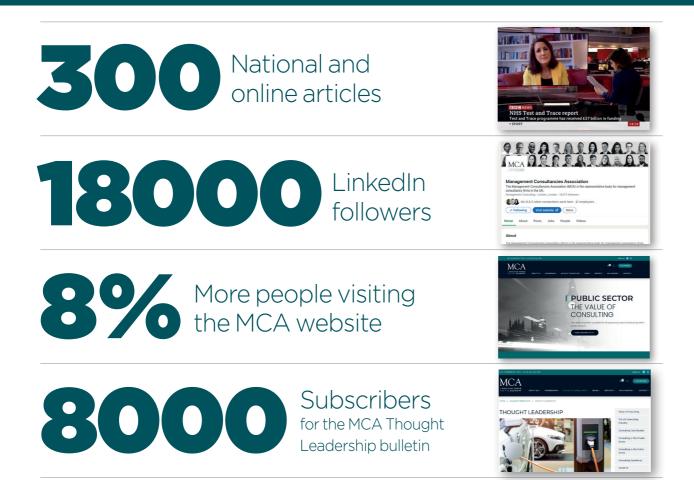

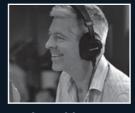
