Associate Award

The new Associate Chartered Management Consultant Award was launched in 2022 and over one hundred young consultants have signed up. Acting as a new interim award it has been developed for those on the journey to becoming fully Chartered and is aimed at giving professionals greater recognition

earlier on in their career. More specifically for consultants who can demonstrate a minimum of 3 years' experience in management consulting. The new Associate Award will provide added value and recognition for individuals on an accredited programme which takes 5 years to complete.

The first individual to successfully complete the assessment is **Ayrton Dhillon**, now at KPMG.

MCA and CMI launch chartered award for young consultants

As the UK consulting industry's body works to standardise the sector, it has helped launch a new ChMC Associate Award for younger consultants. More than 100 individuals are alleady signed up to the latest certification offered up by the Management Consultancies Association and the Chartered Management Institute.

Over the last five years, the Management Consultancies Association (MCA) has been partnering with the Chartered Management Institute (CMI) to roll out a series of qualifications in the UK consulting sector. The industry has traditionally come in for criticism for its lack of quality control, and with the number of independent operators continuing to rise, the initial launch of the Chartered Management Consultant Award (ChMC) sought to re-assure clients of the value for money they get from consultants.

Since the formal launch of the ChMC, demand has gone from strength to strength – as firms recognise it as a differentiating mark of quality that can help assure current and future clients of their offering. Earlier in 2022, this saw the MCA and CMI confirm that the number of ChMC graduates had surpassed 600, while the number currently studying for it had grown beyond the 3,000 mark.


